WHAT IS THE MICROSOFT IT ACADEMY?

Provides a range of official Microsoft online courses and learning resources covering subjects from digital literacy foundation skills to business skills to advanced networking and programming skills.

WHY FUTURE READY TECHNOLOGY SKILLS?

1 out of 2 jobs today require information technology (IT) skills. In less than 10 years, this number will increase to 3 out of every 4 jobs requiring IT skills. (IDC, 2011)

A nationwide job search on one popular job board (indeed.com) shows more than 7,000 open, unfilled, advertised jobs in Washington (January 2013) requiring Microsoft skills and certifications.

WHY WASHINGTON LIBRARIES?

Libraries play an important role in citizen re-skilling for the 21st century workforce. They serve a broad array of people who come to their local libraries to find resources, get help searching for jobs, apply online, and develop resumes. The next step is to help Washingtonians learn basic computer skills through the Microsoft IT Academy.

Washington libraries serve roughly 6.7 million citizens. If only 1% of these citizens participate in IT Academy through libraries, Microsoft training and certification resources would reach approximately 69,000 residents.

If 5% participate, then approximately 345,000 citizens would have access to 21st century skills development. (Washington State Library, 2013)

IT Academy courses would be available through public, community college, and tribal libraries.

The Washington State Library will facilitate this project through some 427 library locations for approximately \$676,368 per year (estimated retail price).
