GUIDES AND INDEXES TO RECORD COLLECTIONS

G1. Guide to the Papers of the Governors of Washington, Volume 1: Territorial Governors, 1853-1889.

A file-level listing of the Washington State Archives' holdings of the papers of Washington's territorial governors, with a cumulative index. Includes a directory of other repositories holding territorial governors' papers, a biographical sketch of each governor, a chronology of Washington's history to 1889, and a list of Washington's other territorial officials. 80 pages \$10.00.

G2. Guide to the Papers of the Governors of Washington, Volume 2: State Governors, 1889-1919.

A file-level listing of the Washington State Archives' holdings of the papers of the first eight state governors, serving from 1889 to 1919. Includes facsimiles of various documents, a comprehensive index, a biographical sketch of each governor, a chronology of events, and a list of state government officials during the period. 147 pages \$10.00

G3. Guide to the Papers of the Governors of Washington, Volume 3: State Governors, 1919-1956.

A file-level listing of the papers of Governors Hartley, Langlie and Walgren. Includes cross-referencing, facsimiles, photos of each governor, and a chronology of events. Indexed. 200 pages \$10.00.

G4. Guide to the Papers of the Governors of Washington, Volume 4 and Supplement: Albert D. Rosellini, 1957-1965.

A file-level listing of the administrative papers of the governor, including files on each state government agency and on subjects of major importance. Includes a comprehensive index. 194 pages in two volumes \$10.00.

G5. Guide to the Papers of the Governors of Washington, Volume 5: Daniel J. Evans, 1965-1977.

A file-level listing of the administrative papers of the governor, including files on each state government agency and on other subjects of major importance during the period. Includes facsimiles of various documents and a comprehensive index. 470 pages \$15.00.

G6. Guide to the Papers of the Governors of Washington, Volume 6: Dixy Lee Ray, 1977-1981.

A file-level listing of the administrative papers of the governor, including files on each state agency's activities and on other subjects of importance during the period. Includes a comprehensive index. 200 pages \$10.00.

G7. Guide to the Papers of the Governors of Washington, Volume 7: John Spellman, 1981-1985

A file-level listing of the administrative papers of the governor, including files on each state agency's activities and on other subjects of importance during the period, including the eruption of Mt. St. Helens and the WPPSS default. Includes a comprehensive index. 246 pages \$15.00

G8. Guide to the Papers of Lieutenant Governor John Cherberg, 1932 - 1988.

A file-level guide to Lieutenant Governor Cherberg's private and public records, covering many aspects of his career in government as well as his career as a football coach. 15 pages \$2.00.

G9. Guide to the Records of the Washington Territorial Supreme Court, 1853 - 1889.

A chronological listing of all of the cases considered by the Territorial Supreme Court. Includes indexes to the names of the plaintiff and defendant in each case, a subject index, and a summary of criminal cases. 40 pages \$5.00.

G10. Guide to the Records of the State Capitol Committee, 1893 - 1968.

The role of the Capitol Committee was to build the capitol and other state buildings. The collection includes plans, correspondence, and photos associated with the construction of Washington's Capitol complex. 39 pages \$5.00.

G11. Guide to the Records of the Legislative Council, 1947 - 1974.

A file-level listing of the files of the Legislative Council, which met between legislative sessions to consider legislation and make recommendations to the Legislature. Includes files on issues and bills considered by the Council and its committees. 187 pages \$10.00.

G12. Guide to the Records of the Washington State Department of Civil Defense, 1951 - 1972.

A file-level inventory of the records of Washington's efforts to prepare for major disasters, including floods, earthquakes, civil unrest and especially nuclear war. 49 pages \$5.00.

G13. Index to Mining Surveys, 1883 - 1964.

An index to the 66 volumes of Surveyor General's surveys of mining claims in the Territory and State of Washington. Arranged alphabetically by name of mine, showing the name of the mining district, volume number and page number. Serves the Surveys of Mining Claims, which are available on microfilm.

G15. Roll On, Columbia: Guide to the Records of the Columbia Basin Survey Commission and the Columbia Basin Commission, 1919 - 1964.

The Columbia Basin Survey Commission was established in 1919 to investigate the possibility of irrigation projects in the Columbia Basin. In 1933 the Columbia Basin Commission was created to act on some of the recommendations of the Survey Commission, resulting in the Grand Coulee Dam and the Columbia Basin Irrigation Project. The guide includes an extensive introduction, a history of the projects and covers both commissions and the construction of the Grand Coulee Dam and the Columbia Basin Irrigation Project. It consists of a file-level inventory of the progress reports, publicity, speeches, engineering information, maps, blueprints, photos, and correspondence. 46 pages \$5.00.

G16. Guide to the Records of the Educational Television Commission and the Public Broadcasting Commission, 1962 - 1983.

The Educational Television Commission was established in 1962 to help public broadcasting organizations qualify for newly available federal funds. In 1980 it was replaced by the Public Broadcasting Commission. The guide consists of a file-level inventory of the reports, surveys, and correspondence, grant applications, hearings, recommendations and cable franchise files. 20 pages \$2.00

G17. Guide to the Records of the Washington Emergency Relief Administration, 1933 - 1957.

The Washington Emergency Relief Administration was established to coordinate relief efforts during the Great Depression. The guide lists all correspondence, studies and issues dealt with by the WERA during this difficult period. 62 pages \$5.00.

G18. Guide to the Records of the Military Department, 1855 - 1975.

A file-level listing of the records of the State Military Department, beginning with the records of the 1855-56 Indian War. Includes listings of general and special orders, files on major military activities, and general subject files.

41 pages \$5.00.

G19. Guide to the Photographs of the Military Department, 1855 - 1967.

An item level inventories of photos taken of soldiers, officers, maneuvers, and military equipment and related subjects. Indexed by original photo number, personal name and dates. 80 pages \$5.00.

G20. Guide to the Photographs of the Washington State Highway Commission, 1910 - 1940.

An item level inventory of photos taken of roads and road construction during the period, showing buildings, vehicles, road building equipment and techniques, and surrounding areas. Includes facsimiles of the photos listed.

180 pages \$10.00.

G21. Guide to the Records of the Oceanographic Commission, 1967 - 1981.

The Oceanographic Commission was established to study the economic potential and environmental protection of the ocean. Its records include minutes, studies, reports, plans, correspondence, speeches and resolutions. 39 pages \$5.00.

G22. Oaths of Office of Officials of Washington State, 1854 - 1978.

An index to all individuals required by law to file an oath of office at the state level. Arranged alphabetically, it provides access to the original signed oaths. Includes 16,316 entries. 330 pages \$50.00.

G23. Map Index.

An index to all of the maps in the custody of the Washington State Archives, showing the name of the place, map size, date and subject category. Includes separate indexes for railroad maps, USGS maps, mining maps, and maps of rivers and tidelands. Lists over 2,400 maps. 350 pages \$50.00.

G24. Guide to the Records of the Washington State Patrol, 1921 - 1979.

A file-level inventory of the correspondence, reports, subject files and photographs of the State Patrol from its establishment in 1921. Arranged by decade, then by subject. 41 pages \$5.00.

G25. Guide to the Records of the Washington State Planning Council, 1934 - 1945.

The Planning Council was originally established to provide long-range economic planning for the state during the Depression. It later became involved in planning for the war effort and for the post-war period. The guide provides a file-level inventory of the correspondence, reports, studies and photographs generated by the agency. 46 pages \$5.00.

G26. Frontier Justice: Abstracts and Indexes to the Records of the Washington Territorial District Courts, 1854 - 1889. Abstracts of each of the more than 37,000 cases heard in the civil, criminal and probate divisions of the courts. Includes a 1,100-page index to all proper names found in the cases and histories of the courts. The abstracts are on two reels of 16-mm microfilm, packaged together with a two-volume hard-copy index and history. \$100.00

G27. Index to the Laws and Memorials of Washington Territory, 1854 - 1889.

A chronological list of the laws, memorials and resolutions passed by the Washington Territorial Legislature, with an alphabetical index by subject. 360 pages \$50.00. See M22 for microfiche copies of the laws served by this index.

G29. Who Killed Laura Law?

A document and artifact inventory of the Aberdeen Police Department's investigation into the still-unsolved murder of Laura Law in 1940. Of particular interest is the radical political material filed in connection with the case, reflecting the tenor of the times. 201 pages \$10.00.

G31. Guide to the Records of the Washington State Horse Racing Commission, 1933 - 1975.

The Horse Racing Commission was established in 1933 to regulate betting on horse races and to ensure that races were run honestly. Its records consist of administrative and investigative files. 11 pages \$2.00.

G32. Guide to the Records of the Human Rights Commission, 1949 - 1973.

File level inventory of the administrative records of the Washington State Human Rights Commission and its predecessor, the Board Against Discrimination. 20 pages \$2.00.

G33. Promotion and Development in Washington State, 1889 - 1972.

Guide to the records of the Bureau of Statistics, Agriculture and Immigration; the State Planning Council; the State Progress Commission; the Division of Progress and Industry Development; and the Department of Commerce and Economic Development. A file-level listing of the records of the state's efforts to promote economic growth, industry and tourism. 168 pages. \$10.00

G34. Guide to the Records of Irrigation, Diking and Reclamation Districts, 1919 - 1955.

File level listing of the State Department of Conservation's files on county irrigation, diking and reclamation projects. Arranged by county. 21 pages \$2.00.

G35. "Galloping Gertie:" Guide to the Records of the Tacoma Narrows Bridge, 1932 - 1969.

The bridge known as "Galloping Gertie" was built during the Depression as a public works project. In 1941 the bridge went down during a storm, and was later rebuilt. The collection includes correspondence, engineering reports and studies, photographs, plans, and other documents. 17 pages \$2.00.

G36. Guide to the Records of the Department of Fisheries, Indian Affairs Files, 1920 - 1979.

A list of files documenting the policies and activities of the Fisheries Department in regard to Indian fishing organized by tribal name. Includes a narrative history and chronology of events. 17 pages \$2.00.

G37. Pacific Northwest Power Planning Council: Guide to the Papers of Chairman Daniel J. Evans, 1981 - 1982.

A file-level listing of the papers of the PNPPC, which developed energy use and conservation policies for Washington, Oregon, Idaho and Montana in the early 1980's. Includes studies, reports and correspondence. 26 pages \$2.00.

G38. Guide to the Case Files of the Washington State Attorney General's Office, 1908 - 1918.

Listings of each case considered by the Attorney General's Office during the period, showing names of plaintiff's and defendants, type of case, dates, subject areas, and notes on important aspects of the case.

Indexed by name and subject. 150 pages \$10.00.

G39. Guide to the Papers of Dr. Wallace Lane and the Washington State Department of Health, 1906 - 1974.

A file level listing of the documents, studies and reports collected by Dr. Wallace Lane during his long career with the Department of Health. 28 pages \$2.00.

G40. Guide to the Records of the Northwest Center for the Retarded, 1965 - 1980.

A file-level list of documents and reports from the Northwest Center, established to provide educational facilities for developmentally disabled children. 16 pages \$2.00.

G42. Prison, Pardon and Clemency Records Useful for Genealogical Research, 1877 - 1985.

An inventory of records from the Governors' Office, the Parole Board (and its successors), the Department of Corrections and the various prisons concerning inmates. Typically, the sources can provide basic information about the crime committed the sentence, personal information about the inmate, and sometimes a photograph. 14 pages \$2.00.

G44. The Elwha River: An Annotated Bibliography of Selected Source Materials.

A summary of research source materials useful in the study of the history of the Elwha River. 16 pages \$2.00.

G45. Territorial Volunteers Papers - Indian War Correspondence, 1855 - 1856. An item-level inventory of the correspondence and orders between Governor Isaac I. Stevens as Commander-in-Chief and his commanders, as well as the correspondence of others in the military leadership during the Indian War. The collection also includes a copy of Colonel Fields' earlier inventory of the same documents, an index to the Indian War Muster Rolls, and a copy of Colonel Fields' "Official History" of the Indian War, prepared in 1961. See Microfilm Publication, M3 and M4 for copies of the actual correspondence and muster rolls. 250 pages \$50.00.

G46. Guide to the Records of Western State Hospital, 1871 - 1979.

Western State Hospital was established in 1871 as the first Washington Territorial Insane Asylum. The files include administrative records, patient admission registers, death records, and general subject files pertaining to treatments and other matters over the years. 30 pages \$2.00.

G47. Guide to Naturalization Records in Washington State.

Naturalization proceedings are a function of the county clerks in Washington. However, over the years many of the earlier naturalization records have been scattered among various repositories within the state. This inventory identifies the location of those records, which originated in the various counties of Washington as to their present location. 13 pages \$2.00.

G49. Guide to the Papers of Nat Washington, 1949-79.

File level inventory of the papers of Nat Washington, Washington State Senator and a leading politician in central Washington. Includes a transcript of an oral interview by Darin Murphy. 241 pages \$20.00

G50. Initiatives and Referendums, 1914-85.

A list and description of each initiative and referendum passed in Washington. 62 pages \$5.00

G51. Guide to the Records of the Washington State Department of Agriculture, 1903-63.

A file-level inventory of the archival records of the Department. Includes a historical time-line and charts showing agriculture production over the years. 62 pages \$2.00

G52. Guide to the Records of the Washington State Centennial Commission,

1984-90. A file-level inventory of the archival records associated with the planning and preparation of the celebration of 100 years of Statehood. Includes newspaper clippings, brochures, local event files, accounting records, contracts, committee files, newsletters, publications, and other materials. 25 pages \$2.00

G53. Guide to the Records of Steamboat Certification, 1927-66.

A short history of the regulation and licensing of steamboats and a guide to steamboat certification files by the name of the company owning the steamboat. 9 pages \$2.00

G54. Guide to the Commissioners' Records of the Washington State Department of Employment Security, 1948-74. A file-level inventory of the administrative files of the Department. 17 pages \$2.00

G55. Guide to the Records of the Urban Affairs Commission, 1967-71.

During the late 1960s student unrest, protests against the Vietnam War and civil rights demonstrations prompted to the state government to study the issues and prepare contingency plans and remedial actions. This is a file-level guide to the records of the Commission. 22 pages \$2.00.

G56. Guide to the Records of the Washington State Highways Department, 1923-85.

A file-level inventory of over 900 boxes of general correspondence and subject files documenting the administration of the Department and the planning and construction of state roads. Includes a history of the Department. 286 pages \$10.00

G57. Abstract of Washington State Government Archival Collections.

A record series listing of all of the state government records in the custody of the Washington State Archives, State Records Branch, in Olympia. 122 pages \$10.00

G62. Guide to the Records of the Washington Liquor Control Board, 1934-1993.

A file-level inventory of the administrative and operational records of the Liquor Control Board, which was mandated to administer all alcohol sales in Washington. 96 pages \$5.00

G63. Guide to the Records of the Washington State Department of Health, 1931-64.

A file-level inventory of the administrative records of the Department. Includes records of the Director's Office, Maternal and Child Health, Crippled Children's Services, and Health Education. 54 pages \$5.00

G64. Guide to the Papers of Justice Barbara Durham, 1980-1999.

A file-level inventory of Barbara Durham's papers as Appellate Court Judge and Supreme Court Judge. Includes Opinion Files, project files, correspondence, and other materials. Barbara Durham began the practice of law in the King County Prosecuting Attorney's Office in 1968. In 1970 she entered private practice, but also served as a part-time district court judge from 1973 to 1977. In 1977 she was elected to the King County Superior Court where she served until 1980 when she was appointed to the Court of Appeals. Durham was appointed to the State Supreme Court in 1985, where she served until retiring in 1999. 33 pages \$3.00

G65. Guide to the Records of the Professional Athletic Commission 1938-93.

A file-level inventory of the Commission, which was established in 1933 to regulate boxing and wrestling matches. Includes minutes of the meetings of the Commission, club reports, event reports, licensing files, newspaper clippings, and administrative records. 36 pages \$3.00

G66. Guide to the Archival Records of License Applications of Physicians, 1909-1921.

A listing of the files of physicians applying for licenses to practice in the State of Washington. Shows name, type of medicine practiced, and date of license, arranged alphabetically by name of applicant. Provides access to the original files, which provide detailed information about the applicants. 80 pages \$5.00

G67. Guide to Archival Records of Licensing Applications of Midwives in Washington State.

A listing of the files of midwives applying for licenses to practice in the State of Washington. Shows name and date of license, arranged alphabetically by name of applicant. Provides access to the original files, which provide detailed information about the applicants. 30 pages \$3.00

G68. Guide to the Papers of the Board of Pilotage Commissioners, 1934-69.

File-level inventory of the records of the Board, which have the responsibility for training, licensing and regulating the pilots who guide ships through the Straits of Juan de Fuca and the waters of Puget Sound. Of special note is that the pilots were required to maintain a log of the ships that they piloted, so these logs constitute records of ships entering Washington waters. 25 pages \$3.00.

G69. Guide to the Papers of Samuel J. Smith, 1954-1991.

Samuel J. Smith served in the Washington State House of Representatives from 1958 to 1966. In 1967 he was elected to the Seattle City Council where he remained for twenty-four years, serving as Council President for eight of those years. Samuel Smith's papers consist of political papers, including campaign material, correspondence, speeches, and newspaper clippings. Subjects include open housing, election reform, civil rights, Seattle history, and political topics. It is arranged by political era, then alphabetically by subject. Includes files on the Legislative Oral History Project done on his life. 7 pages \$1.00

G70. Guide to the Papers of U.S. Senator Daniel J. Evans.

Daniel J. Evans served three terms as governor of the State of Washington (1965-77), was President of The Evergreen State College, chairman of the Northwest Power Planning Council, and served in the U.S. Senate from 1983-1989. This guide is a file-level inventory and index to Daniel J. Evans' senatorial papers, his papers as chairman of the Northwest Power Planning Council, private and family papers from 1926-97, and documents and reports from his various consulting jobs, in particular work for the Carnegie Foundation on global warming and other work done by his firm, Evans and Associates. 226 pages \$15.00.

G71. Guide to the Records of the Washington State Commission on Asian Pacific Americans Affairs 1972-2000.

A file-level inventory of the historical records of the Commission, which was established as an advocate for Asian-American residents of Washington. 30 pages \$3.00

G72. Guide to the Records of the Washington State Public Service Commission, Transportation Division Formal Hearings, 1906-1949.

An inventory of hearings to consider problems, infractions, complaints and other issues pertaining to railroads, toll bridges, street cars, busses, trolleys, docks, warehouses, and railroad scales. This includes records from the Public Service Commission and its predecessors, which included the Railroad Commission (1905-1911). 110 pages \$10.00.

G73. Guide to the Archival Records of the Board of Prison Terms and Parole, 1935-1979.

The Washington State Board of Prison Terms and Parole was established in 1935 to determine the sentence and parole of each adult convicted of a crime. The records consist of minutes, reports, correspondence and legal files. 19 pages \$3.00.

G74 Guide to the Records of the Washington State Board of Audit & Control, 1897-1901.

In 1897 the Washington State Board of Control was established to audit the records and accounts of the state's public institutions, including the mental hospitals, prisons, reform school, and soldiers' home. The collection consists of correspondence, financial audits and reports pertaining to the operations of those institutions. In 1901 it was superseded by the State Board of Control. 7 pages \$2.00.

G75 Guide to the Records of the Washington State Board of Control, 1901-1921.

In 1901 the Washington State Board of Control was established to oversee the operations and administration of the state's public institutions, including the mental hospitals, prisons, reform school, and veterans' homes. The collection consists of correspondence, subject files and reports pertaining to the institutions. In 1921 it was superseded by the State Board of Control.

G76 Guide to the Records of the Washington State Department of Business Control, 1921-1935.

In 1921 the Washington State Department of Business Control was established to oversee the operations and administration of the state's public institutions, including the mental hospitals, prisons, reform school, and veterans' homes. In addition, it was to manage the buildings and grounds of the state capital, centralized purchasing services and industrial management, and to oversee other general government operations.. The collection consists of correspondence, subject files and reports. In 1935 it was superseded by the State Department of Finance, Budget and Business. 12 pages \$3.00.

G77 Guide to the Records of the Washington State Department of Finance, Budget & Business, 1935-1947. In 1935 the Washington State Department of Finance, Budget and Business Control was established to oversee the operations and administration of the state's public institutions, including the mental hospitals, prisons, reform school, and veterans' homes. In addition to the Division of Public Institutions, it included the divisions of Banking, Purchasing, Savings and Loan Associations, Capitol Buildings and Grounds, and Archives. It also ran four canneries for preserving food, beginning in 1939. The collection consists of correspondence, subject files, budget files, and reports. In 1947 it was superseded by the State Department of Public Institutions. 40 pages \$5.00

G78 Guide to the Records of the Washington State Department of Public of Institutions 1947-1955. In 1947 the Washington State Department of Public Institutions was established to oversee the operations and administration of the state's public institutions, including the mental hospitals, schools for the developmentally disabled, prisons, reform schools, and veterans' homes. In addition, it included the divisions of Banking, Purchasing, Savings and Loan Associations, Capitol Buildings and Grounds, Children and Youth Services, Personnel, and Archives. The collection consists of correspondence, subject files, budget files, and reports. In 1955 it was superseded by the State Department of Institutions. 31 pages \$5.00

G79 Guide to the Records of the Washington State Dept. of Institutions 1955-1971. In 1955 the Washington State Department of Institutions was established to oversee the operations and administration of the state's public institutions, including the mental hospitals, schools for the developmentally disabled, prisons, reform schools, group homes, youth camps, and veterans' homes. In addition, it included the divisions of Alcoholism, Juvenile Rehabilitation, Children and Youth Services, Mental Health, and Probation and Parole, . The collection consists of correspondence, subject files, budget files, and reports. In 1971 its functions were absorbed by the Department of Social and Health Services. 102 pages \$10.00.

G80 Guide to the Records of the Washington State Dept. of Transportation History Files 1905-2000. The Washington State Highway Commission was established in 1905 with the mandate to begin the construction of a state-wide network of roads. Later the responsibility was extended to include bridges, ferries and aeronautics, and the name was changed to the Transportation Commission, which supervises the Transportation Department. The collection includes written histories, newsletters, biennial reports, files on individual roads, bridges and ferries, and over 150,000 photographs. The guide is a file-level index designed to lead researchers to specific documents and images. 89 pages \$10.00

G81 Guide to the Records of the Washington State Department of Social and Health Services, Division of Adult Corrections, 1970-81. In 1971 the "super-agency," Department of Social and Health Services, was established, taking over responsibility for managing all of the state's institutions, as well as public assistance and health. Among the institutions were the prisons, which were placed under the Adult Corrections Division. In 1981 a new Department of Corrections was established, which assumed control of the penal institutions. The guide is a file-level inventory of the administrative records of the Adult Corrections Division for the ten years when it was under the Department of Social and Health Services. 34 pages. \$5.00

G82 Guide to the Records of Washington State Ferries, 1926-2004. Records documenting the original acquisition of the ferry system from the Black Ball Line and the administration of the State Ferry System. Includes correspondence, general subject files, news releases, leases and agreements, progress reports, publicity, and other materials. Subjects include the Toll Bridge Authority ferry acquisition, design and construction, fleet operations, ferry routes, terminals, general managers' correspondence, traffic department correspondence, advertising, concessions, labor, pollution, toll collection, complaints, litigation, and other subjects. Also includes files on hydrofoils, hydrofoils, and files on each individual ferry, including the Chetzemoka, Chinook, Chippewa, City of Seattle, City of Tacoma, Crosline, Elwha, Evergreen State, Enetai, Klickitat, Hiyu, Hyak, Illahee, Iroquois, Kalakala, Kaleetan, Kehloken, Klahowya, Kulshan, Leschi, Mendicino, Nisqually, Olympic, Quinault, Rhododendron, San Mateo, Shasta, Spokane, Tillikum, Vashon, Walla Walla, Willapa, Tye, Yakima, and others, as well as constructions plans for modifications to the MV Tye. 25 pages. \$5.00.

G83 Guide to the Records of the Washington State Toll Bridge Authority, 1937-77. The Toll Bridge Authority was established in 1937 to oversee the planning, construction and operation of toll bridges. In 1977 it was absorbed into the new Transportation Department as the Marine Transportation Division. Includes files on the planning, construction and operation of
