Our Washington Letter.
 WASHINGTON, D. C., Feb. 19, 1880.
 EDITOR STRAIGHT.—Hon. William A. Wheeler, that "sweet little cherub that sits aloft" and presides over the United States senate, is named by somebody as a candidate for the presidency. This reveals monetary. In the last month no republican except by an office holder, has talked of any body but Grant or Blaine. There are two or three internal revenue men in North Carolina, and a custom house officer in New York, and a few people in Ohio, who have been speaking of John Sherman, but the extensive except he noticed. Ordinarily the mention of placing Mr. Wheeler would not create a commotion. Rather, it would breed a calm. But as the fight between Grant's friends and Blaine's friends waxed hotter and hotter, the name of Wheeler occurred to some prominent republican who hate turmoil and contention, who desire a canvass which shall not disturb business affairs, and who wish a fair election, and may not be put successfully forward? That is, of course, as a candidate for nomination, for I have no doubt of his or any other man's defeat, who is nominated by the radicals. It is possible that the man who has just mentioned Wheeler is the Edison of republican politics. I don't think the New York State or any other paper, or any citizen should be alarmed at the fact that the government has purchased or is about to purchase from one of its own citizens a stick of land extending from the Atlantic to the Pacific, on the isthmus of Panama. Doubtless a vast majority of our people are opposed to acquisition of Territory on other continents. Not only safety but economy will prevent any such attempt as that. But a route across the isthmus is as much a necessity to us as the Mississippi river. In the development of relations with the east nothing could be so important to the United States as a control of the isthmus. Having an opportunity to secure that foothold in a manner which no government on earth can question, it will be folly for Mr. Hayes and his immediate advisers to neglect it. The administration can do something now which will give it a very different place in history from which it seemed likely to occupy. It can re-assert and maintain the Monroe doctrine, and by the purchase alluded to can go one step farther than Monroe. That step is much more a necessity of the time we live in than the Monroe doctrine was of the time of Monroe. DEM.
