OFF ITS BASE.—The Anacortes Enterprise is off its base by a large majority in its objection to Register Govey's recent designation of the Whatcom Revelle and La Conner Mail as the papers in which Land Office notices for the mainland of Whatcom County should be published, the dividing line between these papers being that running eastward between Townships 36 and 37. In point of geographical distance the Anacortes Enterprise may be as near the Samish district as the La Conner Mail, but the Department has long since ruled—which ruling has the same effect as law—that actual geographical distance does not always determine, but that the character of the paper, together with the routes of travel and means of access thereto is to be taken into account; so also when the intervening distance is mountainous, Samish district having direct overland as well as water communication with La Conner, and being otherwise its principal trading point and base of supplies, turns the scale in favor of the La Conner Mail; while Anacortes is on an island, difficult of access, and being no town or business point, but the merest hamlet, neither the people of the Samish nor any other district have any business there. Hence we say that the Anacortes paper is entirely off its base when it threatens to annihilate Register Govey or anybody else on that account.

PATENTS NOT AFFECTED BY FRAUD.—Judge Sawyer, of the United States Circuit Court of California, rendered a decision recently in the cases of the United States vs. George E., John P. and W. P. White and L. B. Tuttle, civil actions to vacate a United States patent to land alleged to have been obtained under the pre-emption laws through fraud and misrepresentation. The Court holds, in conformity with precedents, that the frauds for which the judgments of tribunals can be impeached are frauds extrinsic or collateral to the matter tried by the first Court and do not extend to a fraud in the matter on which the decision is rendered. In these cases the action is supposed to have been tried in the Land Office which issued the patent, whose decisions are final. Besides, the United States, having received all it asked for the land, \$1.25 an acre, could not allege damage or loss, the United States as a private litigant having no better rights than any ordinary citizen. Courts of Equity do not sit for the purpose of enforcing moral obligations or correcting unconscionable acts. The most that could be said of these cases was that a principle of public policy had been violated by the pre-emptors in swearing falsely. The Court further holds that in view of the looseness in which the pre-emption laws have been administered at the Land Office it would be impetuous to break in upon the precedents and attempt to rectify the evil. It would open a Pandora's box of civil far greater than any compensation arising from doing justice in individual cases. The demurrers to the complaints are sustained and the bills dismissed. Summed up, the decision means that fraud in proving up pre-emption claims does not vitiate a patent issued by the Land Office, and that the United States cannot proceed in civil actions to set aside the patent so obtained.

A LETTER from Collector Morris, of Alaska, expresses regret that want of proper legislation by Congress in regard to Territory has retarded the investment of much capital that might otherwise have been used in the development of the country. Mines are being held without unnecessary investment, waiting for some form of civil government that will afford protection.

IT WOULD seem, remarks the Tacoma Ledger, as if it were high time that something was done in the way of investigating the system, or want of system, which obtains in our penitentiaries and asylums. Scarcely a week passes without either a convict or madman makes a break for liberty and succeeds in escaping the vigilance of his guards.

GENERAL MILLS has left Vancouver for Fort Coeur d'Alene. At the fort he will meet General Sherman and party, and go from there to old Fort Colville; thence over the mountains to Fort Hope and down the Fraser river to Victoria. Mr. Dudley E. Saurin, Secretary of the British Legation at Washington, is one of the party.

AN O. R. & N. Co. official says that it is the impression among the officials of his company that the Oregon Short Line will build down Snake river, tap Walla Walla county, and thence run across the Yakima to the Cascades, and from thence to tide water on the Sound.

FORTY-FIVE dollars per month "and grub" is offered to farm laborers on the Sound. Eight dollars per month is paid in Iowa this season for the same kind of work, and the probability is the Iowa man works the harder of the two, and that the farmer receives no better prices for his products.

EASTERN WASHINGTON is suffering from drought and great heat. One instance of extreme hot weather at Spokane Falls shows the heat to have been 117 degrees in the shade. Grass is drying up and in many places is on fire, burning over many acres.
