LATEST NEWS SUMMARY.

BY TELEGRAPH TO DATE.

Republicans of the 11th district of New York have nominated State Senator Astor for congress.

The Hawaiian brig Pomare, from Honolulu, reports that the island of Maui, one of the Hawaiian group, was visited by a heavy earthquake Sept. 30th.

At the Sandown park club autumn meeting, the race for Cambridgehire trial was won by Lord Harold's Passaic, Kate Riley second, Mark third, Sir Rat.

A cattle train coming south on the C. B. & Q. R. R. was wrecked near Creston, Iowa. Twelve cars were derailed but no one severely injured. Some cattle were killed.

A Prescott dispatch says Deputy Sheriff Bryant was killed while in discharge of his duty, by a desperado named Miller. The murderer escaped. A large force is in search of him.

Telegrams are being received from republicans of Louisiana protesting against the retention of Secretary Hunt in the cabinet, as Louisiana republicans urge Longstreet for the cabinet.

Sardog, a bandit, is said to have killed a Spanish captain and nine privates. He also pillaged and partly burned two villages and threatened to burn all the cane fields if not bought off.

A north-bound freight train on the St. Louis, Hannibal & Keokuk Railroad was derailed near McKim in Missouri, Oct. 19th. A complete wreck was made of the train but no one was injured.

Major Jordan, commanding at Fort Mason, reports that three Flathead Indians were killed near that post, the 17th of Oct. 19th. The following were the names of the murderers and has sent runners to Jacko agency for aid in enforcing his law.

A meeting of stockholders of the Utah & Northern railway was held in Omaha, Oct. 19th. The following directors were elected: Sidney Dillon, S. H. Clark, Thos. L. Kimball, J. W. Garnett, A. J. Poppleton, Samuel Ward and Geo. W. Irwin.

Congressman J. C. Well, of Missouri, has left his wife whom he married while she was a dashing young widow several months ago. Since marriage she has become so much more dashing that he was unable to live with her. He will ask for a divorce.

With the Garfield administration John A. Kasson was first choice for speaker of the house. The work of Gulteau has brought Frank Hiscok nearer the front. George M. Robeson is making an active canvass, and is expected to become the leader of the republican side.

The Sun says editorially: The monopolies are getting deep root in the senate of New men. Camden represents the Standard Oil company, Miller of California the Fair Seal Petroleum Company, New York wood pulp, Wilson is attorney for the Union Pacific railroad, and will serve that interest faithfully.

The N. Y. Post, referring to Vanderbilt's handling of the money market, says: "Whoever knows his intentions has a key to stock speculations. There is a report that the St. Louis & San Francisco has offered the Atlantic & Pacific R. R. Co. and the offer has been declined. None of the bonds of the A. & P. R. are for sale."

It is believed the president will make an appointment before adjournment of the senate of a superintendent of coast and geodetic survey to succeed the late Gen. Carlisle Patterson. Several names of very prominent scientists have been mentioned in connection with the appointment and several have been strongly urged upon the secretary of the treasury and the president. The most prominent, perhaps, is Prof. Julius E. Hilgard, Gen. Cyrus B. Constock, lieutenant-colonel of the corps of engineers, U. S. A., is an applicant for the position and is strongly recommended by Prof. Elias Newcomb, the mathematician.

The residence of N. Jellitch, one mile from Jackson, Cal., was destroyed by fire at 2 o'clock this morning. All the inmates consisting of Jellitch, his wife and two children six and two years old and an infant six months old, perished. Jellitch's remains were found with the infant within a foot of the kitchen door. He had apparently suffocated while trying to escape with his infant in his arms. The bodies of his wife and eldest child were found close together by a bedroom window. The bodies were burned in a cinder. Four men were sleeping with the inmates. The fire is believed to be accidental.

Scoville, Gulteau's counsel, is causing some excitement in political circles because of an avowed intention to make the most of the political aspects of the case. He is reported as saying yesterday there is more of politics in the case than most people imagine. He intends everything connected with the crime shall be developed, and if should have a stalwart to help me might antagonize this case. If it is necessary, I shall not hesitate to bring out the connection of Covilking with the inception of the crime. The stalwart claim was responsible for the matter, etc., and the responsibility of the crime shall be placed where it belongs, if I secure that result. The opinion is very general here Judge Cox will decide he had no jurisdiction. Robert T. Myrick, who will urge this point for Scoville, is quite sure there is no jurisdiction, and says the circuit court of the district has decided in that way in two similar cases. Myrick also remarked he could not see how Judge Cox, as it has been stated he can require him to change the question of jurisdiction disposed of before the trial of the case commenced. For, said he, the prisoner has pleaded not guilty, as he had a perfect right to do, and I cannot see how the judge can require him to change the issue thus made. It was a mistake to arraign the prisoner if the judge was in doubt as to his jurisdiction.

At Mystic Park, Boston, Oct. 23d, Leori rode 20 miles in 50 minutes and 56-1-4 seconds, under the name of the "Lioness."

In a criminal court on the 22d Judge Cox assigned as associate counsel in the Gulteau case, Leigh Robbins.

St. Julien beat Trinkel in a trotting race at Philadelphia on the 24th in three straight heats. Best time, 2:17.

The station Santa Claus has been sold for \$25,000 to John Shaw, owner of Trinkel, and Wm. Kohl, of San Francisco.

The Erie railway will soon run through trains to Boston from the west crossing on the Hudson river at Newburg.

The board of trade has placed officers in the Cleveland office of Galway in the Tyne, fearing she is destined for Chile.

Garfield's body was quietly transferred on the 22d from the public receiving vault to Capt. Scoville's vault, the finest in Lake View cemetery.

The original sum of £500,000, given by the late George Peabody in 1825 as a fund for building lodging-houses for the poor in London, now amounts to £720,000.

It is estimated that 43,070 tons of produce, including 10,744 tons of coal, were lost in the wreck of the English coast. A majority of the wrecked vessels were loaded with common but general produce, as well as building materials. The petroleum, herring, tar and oil cargo was lost.

The balance of losses are salt, iron and timber. Five ships dismantled and abandoned in the recent terrible gales have been picked up and towed into port.

Capt. Adams, of the whaler, visited the scene of the wreck of the Franklin expedition. He found the house and store of provisions near the Franklin monument, in a wretched condition. In Fury and Hecla straits the Eskimo hunters maintained a watchful eye to clear up the fate of the last survivors of the Franklin expedition. After they lost the ships, seventeen men started on a march to reach Hudson's bay. Only three survived the journey to the home of the narrator's father. One of these, supposed to be Lieut. Crozier, died first. The death of the others followed.

Michl Henry, home rule member of parliament for County Galway, issued a circular to his tenants, pointing out that if any of them think they can get better terms from the land court, he has neither power nor wish to prevent them, but he would not maintain any lease, whether for rents and other advantages. He says he is willing to allow a reduction of from 15 to 20 per cent on the half year's rent due on May last, but hereafter the old rents would be paid. He hopes the court will be cheerfully paid and that tenants will not abide in false friends and teachers and reverse the relations hitherto existing between them and their landlords, and character as honest men.

The New Mexican publishes a communication from Villa de San Buenaventura, Mexico, under date of Sept. 30th, giving an account of a fight with Indians on Sept. 25th, near Death Point. The Indians attacked the cattle ranches, and killed some horses. Sixty well armed and mounted citizens, headed by the mayor of the town, immediately went in pursuit and overtook the Indians in canyon del Cristo. In the fight which ensued the Mexicans lost eight horses killed and one man wounded. The Mexicans retreated. The Indian loss could not be ascertained. A Mexican woman of Cuero, N. M., and a Mexican boy aged 9 years, who were captured by Indians last August in New Mexico, escaped from the Indians near the scene of the fight and joined the Mexican party. From them the following facts were learned: The Indian party consisted of twenty bucks, with three families and are remnants of Victoria's band, led by Victoria's brother. They have with them four other captives, whose ages range from 7 to 10 years. Most all from New Mexico. The Indians are well equipped in every respect. Their intention is to proceed to the mouth of the river, and exchange their white captives for Indian captives.

The speakership of the house is as much a matter of pure speculation as the president's cabinet. Guiteau's Statement.

In Guiteau's carefully prepared statement of what led to the act of assassination he says that disappointment in the matter of the Paris Consularship did not influence him in the slightest. In fact, he felt confident he would receive the appointment. He says he felt greatly troubled in mind over Mr Conkling's resignation and the political complications resulting therefrom, and conceived the idea that everything would go better if the President was "removed."

Having at the end of two weeks made up his mind to do the deed he began to prepare himself. He bought a revolver and began to dog the President's steps. The Sunday before his victim went to Long Branch he saw him at church and came near shooting him. He would have shot him at the depot, but for compassion for Mrs. Garfield who was clinging to the President's arm. He afterward dogged the President's steps whenever he emerged from the White House, and one evening followed him close to Mr. Blaine's residence.

He knew the President expected to leave for Long Branch on Saturday morning. He made up his mind to do the deed then, believing that he was acting under Divine command. He went to the depot and engaged a hackman to take him to the Congressional Cemetery after a while. Then he gave his private papers, including "The Truth, a Companion to the Bible," to the young man at the news stand to keep for him. He said: "I examined my revolver to see that it was all right and took off the paper that I had wrapped around it to keep the moisture off. I waited five or six minutes longer, sat down on a seat in the ladies' room and very soon the President drove up. He was in company with a gentleman who I understood was Mr. Blaine, and I am satisfied it was Mr. Blaine, although I did not recognize him. The President got out on the pavement side and Mr. Blaine on the other side. They entered the ladies' room; I stood there watching the President and they passed by me. There was quite a large crowd of ticket purchasers at the gentlemen's ticket office in the adjoining room; the depot seemed to be quite full of people. There was quite a crowd and commotion around and the President was in the act of passing from the ladies' room to the main entrance through the door. I should say he was four or five feet from the door nearest the ticket office, in the act of passing through the door to get through the door to the cars. He was about three or four feet from the door. I stood five or six feet behind him, right in the middle of the room, and as he was in the act of walking away from me I pulled out the revolver and fired. He straightened up and threw his head back and seemed to be perfectly bewildered. He did not seem to know what struck him. I looked at him; he did not drop; I thereupon pulled again. He dropped his head, seemed to reel and fell over. I do not know where the first shot hit; I aimed at the hollow of his back; I did not aim for any particular place, but I knew if he got those two bullets in his back he would certainly go. I was in a diagonal direction from the President, to the westward, and suppose both shots struck. I was in the act of putting my revolver back into my pocket when the depot policeman seized me and said: 'You shot the President of the United States.' He was terribly excited; he hardly knew his head from his feet, and I said 'Keep quiet, my friend; keep quiet, my friend. I want to go to jail.' A moment after the policeman seized me by the left arm and clinched me with terrible force. The officers, one on each side of me, rushed me right off to the police headquarters, and the officer who first seized me says: 'This man has just shot the President of the United States,' and he was terribly excited. And I said: 'Keep quiet, my friend; keep quiet; I have got some papers which will explain the whole matter.' Then they searched me and put me into a cell."

Commenting on the above, the Philadelphia Times remarks editorially: "Guiteau's detailed narrative of the inception, preparation and execution of his plan for 'removing' President Garfield shows him to have been one of the most deliberate and methodical assassins that history has known. To speak of such a man as crazy is obviously absurd, if we use the word to indicate any lack of ordinary understanding and responsibility. Indeed, the instances are rare in which murder has been planned with so clear an understanding of its character and consequences, and if there ever was a case in which the extreme penalty of the law was distinctly called for it is in this, for the protection of society and as a warning to those who may be disposed to share Guiteau's political and personal ideas and motives."

Secretary Windom, on retiring from the Cabinet the other day, was re-elected to his former position as United States Senator—from Minnesota. Mr. Windom made a good Secretary of the Treasury, and being a leading and influential Senator in Congress stands a good chance of the Presidency in 1884, being probably the most available compromise candidate in the country; and men of such unexceptionable qualities have of late years been in demand for Presidential "timber."

This, from the Seattle Post-Intelligencer, is strictly to the point, and entirely accords with our idea of the matter:

"Our telegraphic columns this morning illustrate forcibly the difference in treating crime by the Governments of England and the United States. Parnell, a leading man of the British nation, for merely talking and writing, has been thrown into prison and is denied even the privilege of a private consultation with his lawyer. Guiteau, a low, vile scoundrel and villain, for murdering the head of the American people and Government, is tenderly cared for in prison, and is given every opportunity to make his escape in any manner compatible with law; his lawyer and witnesses even being hired by the Government and people he has so deeply and cruelly wronged. Such a travesty upon justice as this was never seen outside of the United States. Give us, say we, at least a half measure of the just severity for which our neighbors across the Atlantic are noted, and less of this maudlin sympathy, so encouraging to crime, which disgraces the administration of American law."

There is a very pretty story told how a lovely Jewess in a Russian town saved her property and her life during the recent attacks upon the Jews. A great hulking ruffian entered her shop and bought a loaf of bread. After swallowing a couple of mouthfuls he threw himself on the ground outside the shop door and began to howl pitifully that he was poisoned—the Jews had poisoned him. Of course an infuriated crowd instantly assembled, and it would have fared ill with our Jewess if she had not dashed out of the shop, and snatching the bread from the impostor's hand began to eat in sight of them all. The crowd stopped, thunderstruck. A broad grin dawned on every countenance. One of them called out to her: "Alosha, lend me your knout, will you?" Then the impostor started to his feet and ran off, pursued by a mischievous but no longer sanguinary crowd.

GORDON'S TRIBUTE TO GARFIELD.—General G. W. Gordon, ex-Confederate, in an address in memory of Garfield at the Circuit Court at Memphis, said: "While his steps were in the dust, his eyes were on the stars. By courage, toil, talent, integrity and sobriety, he fought his way, single-handed and alone, from the hovel to the White House. By these instrumentalities he passed from the humblest to the highest station, not only in his own country, but I submit, to the most noble, exalted and enviable position to day held by any citizen of the world. And although he ascended from a level so low to an eminence so high, it did not dazzle him nor lessen his humility. He was one of the few men of the world's great history whom prosperity humbles and adversity strengthens. I had rather possess the culture, the oratory and the genius of Garfield than all the blood stained laurels that ever Caesar tore from the livid brows of fallen kings, or all the jewels that ever Hannibal stripped from the frozen fingers of his slaughtered knights. The wisdom, moderation and reform foreshadowed in his brief administration were daily widening his influence and popularity, especially with the people of the South, and we hoped that he was hastening the day when we could all feel and say we have but one sky, one flag, one Union, one country and one President."

LAST TUESDAY Mr. Villard and the distinguished party accompanying him, sailed from Portland for San Francisco, on the steamship Oregon. The vessel got aground on one of the mudbanks so numerous in the Columbia river, and the combined efforts of two powerful steamboats were required to pull her off.—Tacoma Ledger.

Tax California Supreme Court has confirmed the judgment of the lower court in the case of J. H. Clementshaw, who was convicted of perjury in swearing that the late Charles De Young fired the first shot at young Kalkoff.

Victoria, B. C., reports the entire population including Chinese and Indians not living on reserves, is 4,500. Had the census been taken sharp April 4 it is believed that it would have "kicked the beam at 5,000. This gives a population close on 11,000 for Vancouver Island alone, and adding the mainland will make a population of 25,000 for the Province.


