VILLARD has made an assignment of his property for the benefit of creditors. Only a few weeks ago Villard rode on the top wave of public opinion, feted, toddled, entertained a following of sycophants and fair weather friends. Now the great man has been swept aside like a broken reed, beset by wilful flatterers, scorn of his power and position, few to speak well of him "and none so poor to do him reverence."

The decision of the managers of the Northern Pacific road, making Tacoma the terminus of that highway, has had a very stimulating effect upon that city, and produced a corresponding degree of depression at Portland. The system followed by Villard while holding power of flying fast and loose between the Sound points and the Oregon metropolis kept the several places in an intermittent fever. This mode of operation had the virtue of substituting art and slyness, that rebounded, in the atmosphere of doubt, uncertainty and hope, to the benefit of the railway, as by abstaining from the people of Portland were themselves that they were securing future benefits off which to fatten. All things and representations may be fair on the part of men having certain ends to attain, but while we have no deep affection for Portland, we are of the opinion that that city, now in sack cloth and ashes, has been most woefully imposed upon. It remains to be seen whether or no this change of base is to materially effect the growth of Portland. There can be no doubt, however, that for the time being that city has had a serious setback, and that the people who have incumbered themselves with a great debt, are feeling decidedly gloomy over the present unsatisfactory outlook.

A PETITION has been circulated and numerously signed assigning President Arthur to appoint our townsman, Jas. N. Glover, Esq., to the office of Governor of Washington Territory. The memorial is the outgrowth of a desire on the part of some of the leading Republicans of our city to see a representative citizen of Washington Territory installed in an office that should, in its very nature, be occupied by a man conversant and familiar with the wants and requirements of the large member that occupies so elevated a place in the list of States and Territories of the Federal Government. Mr. Glover was not a party to the origin of the instrument that asks the appointment, nor has he been an aspirant to the office. It is the work of disinterested friends alone, who have no other motive in presenting the claims of the gentleman than that of pure friendship, at the same time feel that their choice is in every respect capable of filling the highly honorable office. It is a long time custom for Presidents to fast upon the Territories Governors taken from the ranks of the dominant party considered most worthy of preference for valuable and recognized in a campaign, and too often are the capabilities and requirements lost sight of in this generous distribution of public favors. We do not consider that this mode of procedure is in keeping with fairness and justice to the people inhabiting the Territories, and is a reflection, to a certain degree, upon their intelligence. It is, or should be, presumable that the people ever whom one of so high authority rules would entertain a desire to have a voice in the choice of the occupant of the gubernatorial chair, and it would strengthen the sympathy and respect of said people in the appointing power and the party represented if they should be permitted to make suggestions as to who would best suit them for Governor, and have the same respected. The appointing power vested in the Chief Executive is a prerogative that is reserved for personal advancement, and one that is most jealously exercised, and such being the case we have grave fears that any suggestions on the part of the public in reference to the appointment will not meet with favor. Yet this feeling, growing out of a knowledge of the policy followed by the Executive, does not at all affect our sincere hope that President Arthur may be led to turn from the beaten track of his predecessors and grant the Republicans of this Territory a hearing in this instance, and name James N. Glover as Governor.

Mr. Glover is a life-long Republican, of progressive ideas, and possessed of all the elements requisite for making a first-class officer. Once in the executive chair he would make a record of which his adherents would be proud, and conduct the affairs of the position with a conscientious fearlessness, firmness and ability that would win the respect and approval of even his enemies. Mr. Glover has been a resident of this coast and the Northwest since 1849, and his long sojourn here has enabled him to become thoroughly conversant with those interests that might be fostered and upheld to the great advancement and advantage to the Territory by one holding the Governorship. It would give us great pleasure to see Mr. Glover attain the goal sought after for him by his supporters, and believe that if the effort had been pushed forward at an earlier date its success might have been insured. It may not now be too late, if properly managed, and the prize is sufficiently great to infuse life and activity into those interested in the worthy cause.

SPOKANE AWAKE.

An Enthusiastic Meeting that Resolves itself into Something Definite.
United and Cheerful Action by the entire Public.

We were gratified to see the large and enthusiastic crowd of representative business men present at Cannon's Hall Friday night assembled on the call for a public meeting. The meeting was called to order by Col. G. H. Morgan, and on motion Mayor Jas. N. Glover was chosen Chairman and M. T. Harrison, Secretary. Stirring and telling addresses were made by S. C. Hyde, Geo. T. Crane, F. R. Moore, J. T. McArthur, G. H. Morgan, E. J. Webster, Judge Bettis, J. J. Browne, Chas. Sweeney, Chas. Webster, M. Thompson. The gist of the talk was that Spokane Falls, from its location ought to and could command the trade of the mines. To expedite business the following committee of fifteen was appointed to organize a Board of Trade, arrange for the establishment of a transportation company, etc. Geo. T. Crane, Chas. Sweeney, M. Thompson, L. Ziegler, R. Schoedlin, A. M. Cannon, C. N. Bunce, Jno. L. Wilson, G. H. Morgan, F. R. Moore, Judge Bettis, J. L. Binkley, Jas. E. Roe, E. J. Webster, J. J. Browne.

This committee meets at the law office of J. J. Browne this evening. Now that a move has been made for all parties lay aside all differences and unite in working for the general interests of the city. The people are awake, the time is ripe, and now or never is the moment for action. "Push" should be the watchword, and the whole people moving in concert, can accomplish what otherwise could never be attained. May the movement on foot bear abundantance of good fruit.

A Great Move.
Mr. Garrison, a gentleman who has had considerable experience running pack trains in mineral districts, has perfected arrangements for running a pack and saddle train from Spokane Falls immediately into the mines. Last Tuesday the first departure was made, and the cavalcade of animals that started on the journey was loaded down with a variety of articles for the mines. It is the intention to make the trip regular every week, starting from the Sprague House, where orders for transportation may be left. This enterprise is the first of a large number that are soon to be put in operation from the Falls. In spite of all reports to the contrary it will be much easier for men to ship goods into and reach the mines from Spokane Falls than any point on the coast. Other places may be a trifle nearer, but impediments exist that will make the routes more inconvenient than that from this city. An old, well repaired and easily traveled road leads from this city to either the Post or the Mission where it connects with the trail now being built by Mr. Small with capital partially furnished by our business men. Not only is the route superior from this city, but right here men going to the mines can procure outfits cheaper than any where in the north-west. This cannot be denied, and if men heading for the diggings study their own interests they will immediately come to Spokane to fit out. Mr. Garrison, as the pioneer packer direct from this city, should receive the encouragement of the people, and all those having goods to ship into the mines ought to patronize him. He will also give transportation to parties traveling for the new Enterprise. We had with pleasure this movement that should have been inaugurated at least three months ago, and we feel satisfied that it will result profitably to the originator. Mr. Garrison has a number one outfit, which will be increased as the demand for carrying increases.

More in the Name Boat.
It seems that an epidemic has struck our business men, and a great many are galloping up to Rathrum to get hold of desirable lots upon which to build branch business houses. The consequence of this anxiety to secure real estate has had the effect to swell the prices of lots to such dimensions as to frighten even those who have made it a life-long practice to deal in town dirt with a tendency to shoot upwards. The number of home merchants who have made the trip to our neighborhood town with the intention to branch is greater than our readers have any idea of, but in many cases those hunting for eligible sites have been disappointed. Among those who have succeeded are L. Ziegler and Chas. Carson. Mr. Ziegler, who has been in the stove and tinware business here for a number of years, and who has accumulated much physical and financial vigor therefrom, has always shown an activity in taking the lead in the location of branch houses, and in this instance will put a large stock of those goods indispensable to the miner in at Rathrum. Mr. Carson has purchased a lot opposite the depot upon which he will at once proceed to erect a substantial building to be used as a restaurant. He will give his new possession his individual attention until spring, when he will again take charge of his large and paying property here. We wish the gentlemen luck with their new departure.
