The Cheney Tribune man does the duty art handsomely in his reply to our article of last week, but makes no denial. The most cruel charge in the record is that we are paid to write up Spokane Falls. As we have put in from twelve to eighteen hours' work per day ever since coming here, and have to scratch to pay off Saturday nights, and do not love hard work for the fun of it, the pay we are working for is terrible small, so small indeed that we never see even all we earn. Our space and fine prevents us from answering at length.

There is an obscure publication at Missoula that we believe is very anxious to get its name before the public by a few notices from the press of the surrounding country, the name of which escapes us at the present time. It seems fit to stamp out falsehoods the statements recently made in the Review regarding the Trout Creek trail. If the billious writer, who imagines he knows it all, will refer to a correspondence in another column of this issue from a party on the ground, whose interests are at Trout Creek, he will find a few unadulterated truths that prove the correctness of the statements we have heretofore made. The fact that the same paper is attempting to "boom" the new Belknap route is convincing evidence that its faith is sadly shaken in the Trout Creek trail, and is willing to desert it under the first pretext. Parties going into the mines will readily learn from the most practical routes to travel, and in that choice we have no fears whatever that the road from Spokane Falls will be neglected.

It seems to be a practiced system with some of the papers of the coast to ignore Spokane Falls entirely as a fitting out point for the Coeur d'Alene mines, and yet the very circumstances in connection with the favorable notices of other points along the Northern Pacific road in juxtaposition to the mineral fields tend to prove that shipping points outside of Spokane Falls and Rathdrum are mere experiments, and all transitory with no prospect of cutting a figure in the mine excitement beyond the momentary importance lent them by newspaper notices.

This is clearly demonstrated in the manner in which the "boom" jump first from one point and then to another. First it was Hiron, then Trout Creek, then Hope, then Gold Run, then Belknap, and heaven only knows what particular spot the would-be town makers will light upon next. To a great extent all these routes have proven impracticable, or why should they be abandoned? The truth is that the natural location of the mines, hedged in with rough and rugged mountains, cut up with streams that swell to mighty torrents in the spring time, make egress and ingress to the mines an undertaking accompanied with more or less inconvenience. Especially is this the case at this season of the year, when snow lays to the depth of several feet, ice crowds in for supremacy, and the biting air of winter searches through and through the traveler. Of all the trails into Eagle City the one by the way of the Mission and Evolution has been the only one over which pack trains have been able to reach the camp, during the winter, and is the oldest route in use. There are two other routes that can and will be opened as soon as the weather permits. The best one of the two is by the way of the Big Meadows. It is almost on a line from Spokane Falls and the Transportation Company of this city is now making the preliminary arrangements for opening it up as rapidly as the work can be done. This trail crosses Eagle Creek but once, and that near Eagle City. When open stages will run direct from the Falls into Eagle City, and prospectors can buy coupon tickets on the railroad for the mines via Spokane Falls. All efforts that may be made to divert travel in another direction will fall signally, and judging from the present drift of the stream of gold hunters the largest number will select this route. Besides the advantages of transportation our city holds out the great attraction of being the best point from which to draw supplies within reach of the mines. Here are located immense wholesale houses able to compete in prices with San Francisco and Portland, and handling every line of goods that the camp makes a demand for. Without the aid of outside support Spokane Falls has taken the position as the key to the Coeur d'Alene mines and as such will remain were a thousand new towns along the road to spring into existence as the "only direct route to the mines." The merchants propose to do their part in holding the line by treating the people of the mines with liberality and fairness, and by providing goods whereby the camp dealers can afford to continue trading at this place. The Transportation Company will also do toward holding this supremacy by providing quick and comfortable transportation at prices that will satisfy the traveling public.

**THE MINER'S MECCA.**

**Scrape from the Great Gold Field.**

We had a call Tuesday from G. R. Tenness, who had just arrived from Eagle City. Mr. Tenness is a deputy U. S. surveyor, an intelligent young gentleman and a constant residence in the mines of several weeks has made him conversant with the country. He came in over the Trout Creek trail, a route as rough as one could imagine, some places existing where nothing had to be cut in the ice to add in climbing over steep hills. It is impracticable for pack trains, and as soon as the snow melts can not be used at all. He informs us that several towns have sprung up, but the chief one will be Eagle City. The town is well situated for making a large place. Prospecting is reduced to talk, and no one is able to form any idea of the extent of the diggings, most of the reports being mere speculation. He thinks that the quartz veins will prove the backbone of the camp. According to his calculation there are up and down of 2,000 people on the ground, and he passed 117 on the trail going in, an almost constant stream of humanity flowing toward the mines. He spoke of the Trout Creek trail, and mentioned the wisdom of those who are going in at this season of the year.

All Jones, an old Spokaneite who has spent several months at Eagle City, arrived in Spokane Wednesday. He went off "all broke up," but returns looking as rugged as a buffalo robe. He returns to camp in a few days and stays with us. We are indebted to him for many bits of news from the get along. The first serious skirmish of the camp occurred last Saturday. A stranger named Nelson came into Eagle City and took possession of a lot. An "H. H. miner" known as Three-fingered Jack, and who had the poverty in digits, owned the lot and requested Nelson to vacate, stating that if he would dig under the snow he would find a house foundation. Nelson invited him to visit a better climate than that of the mines, and Jack insisted on a vacation with the argumentative revolver. One that struck Nelson under the right arm, breaking a rib and glancing around the body. The revolver failed to work and Jack was compelled to retreat to his hole. Nelson followed close behind with an ax. After running about 200 yards Jack fell and Nelson struck at him, but missed the distance and only the ax of the ax struck Jack on the back. Nelson was evidently angry as he whipped out a knife and was just in the act of striking for Jack's head when bystanders interfered and put an end to the row. We are told that if Nelson can keep out of reach of the only doctor in camp he is certain to recover.

A man named Johnson, who knuckled himself in the leg between the knee and ankle with an ax some weeks ago, and died last Friday from the effects of the injury. This is the second death that has occurred in Eagle City. (Clim jumping is the order of the day and in all probability a great deal of trouble will grow out of it.) There are two steam engines and numerous sleighs and wagons abandoned on the several trails. It is now said by men who are well acquainted with the country that the Big Meadows route is the only one over which a good wagon road can be made. Dan Drummer now has men out looking over the trail with the intention of constructing a road at once.

Boyer creek is said to be a very promising gulch. It is about 12 miles from Eagle City. Three weeks ago there was hardly 800 men in the diggings. Now there are over 2,000, and the number increasing every day.
