MISCELLANEOUS ITEMS.

At Detroit, recently, an ox was killed because he did not understand the French language. The team, consisting of one English and one French ox, drawing a heavy load driven by a French driver, was crossing the track when the express train made its appearance. The driver, in great excitement, immediately ordered his oxen to "chuck," (the French word for "show.") The French ox understood him turned off the track and saved himself; but the English ox never having studied the language, pressed further on and was instantly killed.

A late Chicago paper says that in the case of Dr. Adams against Dr. Schmidt, in an action of trespass to secure damages alleged to have been sustained by the plaintiff on account of a cow-hiding, the jury returned the following verdict: "We, the jury, find that the defendant, Dr. Schmidt, should make three boxes of pills, and that the plaintiff, Dr. Adams, should swallow them."
