MASSACRE OF EMIGRANTS.

The Vancouver Chronicle has received a special dispatch from Tracy & Co's Express, dated Dallas, Oct. 3d, giving the particulars of the massacre of a train of forty-six emigrants, as follows:—

J. Schriener has just arrived at this place, with news of the massacre, by the Snake Indians, of an entire emigrant train consisting of 46 persons, 19 of whom were men, the balance women and children—8 wagons, 64 oxen and a large number of loose stock.

The party was first attacked about 50 miles west of Salmon Falls, on the 14th of Sept. This attack lasted about an hour, when the Indians withdrew and allowed the train to proceed about five miles to a ravine, where they again attacked them—the fight lasting two days and one night.

Of the nineteen males in the party, six were discharged soldiers, and two emigrants—who left on horseback, did not leave until the Indians had complete possession of the train, and from the screams of the women and children is led to believe the whole party were butchered.
