THE REVENUE STAMPS.

After the first day of January next, all written contracts, agreements, conveyances, mortgages, &c., to be legally binding, must have appended a revenue stamp.

Under the present arrangement for the circulation of these stamps, we cannot see how embarrassment is to be avoided; for money just now is too valuable to be suffered to lie idle for months...

The following circular has been issued for the information of those interested, with the view of facilitating the operation of the law:
