I was much pleased as well as surprised in the manner in which reading classes acquitted themselves; nor do I think I am bestowing too much praise in saying that the reading of some of the little girls not over ten years of age, would do credit to those who occupy the desk or the pulpit.

The classes in political geography appeared to be well acquainted with the subject; and the classes in physical geography, geology and astronomy acquitted themselves in a very creditable manner.

The French class appeared to have made considerable progress, but being unacquainted with the language, I am unable to judge of the proficiency the pupils may have acquired.

In conclusion, I would say that the Sisters of Charity deserve every encouragement in their undertaking in the cause of education. Their system appears more for usefulness than show. They evidently lay the foundation for a sound education by first teaching in a thorough manner the rudiments of every branch before proceeding farther.
