Council Proceedings.

Mr. Lanster appeared as counsel for C. Kraft, and asked that the vote allowing to Mr. Kraft, \$70 for building bridge on 5th street, be reconsidered, and the matter be again taken under consideration.

On motion, the Clerk was instructed to notify the Treasurer to convert the cash on hand, in Cemetery Fund, into currency, and transfer the same to general fund.

On motion, Committee on Health and Police were instructed that no further supplies would be furnished Mrs. Murphy by the City.
