A New Era in the History of Seattle—See Future Assured.

What the Recent Transfer Means—A Full and Complete Explanation.

[From the Seattle Post, October 15.]

No longer can it be claimed that we are groping in the darkness of an uncertain future.

No longer can our fortunes as a city be said to hang upon the threat of possible future contingencies; for already the Rubicon has been passed in triumph.

The die of events cast, and the tables turned completely in our favor. In the events recently the curtain of past misgivings was so effectively rung up as to forbid the future to a certainty.

THE FINAL TRANSFER.

Of the Seattle and Walla Walla Railroad Wednesday from the original corporation to Henry Villard, Esq., of New York city means a deal more so far as Seattle and her future and present interests are concerned, than many of our readers suppose.

It renders our city beyond all possible controversy the present nucleus of the grand railroad center and terminus of the great Pacific coast.

It is the nucleus of the great Pacific coast, and for all time past misgivings and doubts and to where that terminus may be located. The impression has been

out that the road has been purchased and become part of the property of the O. R. & N. Co., and consequently it may mean a "rip-up" than which nothing could be more of the mark.

The road was already stated to have been purchased by Henry Villard, Esq., of New York, and together with 149,000 acres of valuable agricultural land recently purchased by the same party of the Northern Pacific Railroad company, north of Snake river in the eastern portion of this Territory, is to constitute the integral of a new company to be formed in New York city in January next.

THE ONLY POSSIBLE CONNECTION.
