FOR THE PEN D'ORVILLE.—A number of teams passed through Walla Walla on Sunday last with the machinery for the boat now being built by the O. S. N. Company to run on the Pen d'Orville River.

STORMY WEATHER.—For several days back, we have enjoyed a regular succession of "high-heel" weather—heavy falls of rain, followed by high winds. The rains have thoroughly moistened the ground, and all that is now required is for the rain to hold up to enable the farmers to get through with their fall plowing.

A HORSE THIEF.—A young man named David Williams, who was employed as a hand on D. R. King's place, on Dry Creek, was sent to town on Thursday last week with a load of hay. Arrived in town, he forged an order on the man to whom he delivered the hay, on which he obtained \$10. He also forged an order on D. S. Baker & Co., on which he got a pair of pants. He next endeavored to sell his employer's team, but not finding a purchaser, he took one horse and decamped. Not returning home, Mr. King became alarmed, and coming to town, learned the true condition of affairs. It was ascertained that he had gone in the direction of Wallula, where he was followed by Mr. K., and overtaken at the very time he was endeavoring to sell the stolen horse. The rascal was brought to town, and on examination before O. P. Lacy, Justice of the Peace, was committed in default of \$500 bail, to answer the charge of horse stealing and forgery, at the next term of the District Court. The accused is quite a youth, but evidently a confirmed rascal.

During Highway Robbery. The Virginia City (Nevada) Enterprise has the following particulars of the robbery of a stage, which for cool daring has scarcely had a parallel on this coast:

Between 1 and 2 o'clock yesterday morning, as the two stages of the Pioneer line by the Dunsmuir road, California, were on their way to this city, and had reached a point near the summit of the Geiger grade, some three or four miles from here, they were ordered to stop, by a band of highwaymen, who suddenly made their appearance from the roadside, presenting guns in a manner not to be mistaken. In company with this promptly ordered, both drivers were to get their horses, one coach being immediately behind the other. The passengers of whom there were fourteen, besides the two drivers, were at once ordered out of the coaches, the robbers telling them that they were after Wells, Fargo & Co.'s treasure. The drivers were then made to dismount, and the horses were to get their bits of the way, as the treasure safe, which was in the foremost coach, had to be blown open with gunpowder. The passengers were all gathered together and a guard placed over them, while two of the party proceeded to open the safe. In this, however, they found quite a difficulty, having first to cut the hinges of the padlock, and then the heavy bars before they could get at the keyhole. For this, however, they were prepared, having brought along with them the requisite hammer and cold chisel for the purpose. They then poured into the safe a pound and a half of powder—judging from the two empty cans found in the road, that they were inserting a piece of fuse the safe soon exploded with a tremendous report, it being of boiler iron. As soon as the smoke cleared away the booty was secured, consisting of the sum of \$5,100 in gold coin, \$5,000 of which belonged to Wells, Fargo & Co., and the balance to other parties, and the express which contained the money, and other valuables which they might have about them as they mounted the coach. There was one lady among the passengers, but the gentleman agents gallantly refrained from exacting tribute from her. The drivers too, were not robbed, the fellows remarking that they "earned whatever they had hard enough, and they didn't believe they had any more, which will be permitted to hitch up and drive off, which they did with great alacrity, arriving about 3 o'clock in this city. The coach with the passengers arrived first in town soon followed by the wrecked one. Information was at once lodged with the police, and before daylight, Captain Downey, together with the teachers of Wells, Fargo & Co.'s Express office were out at the scene of the robbery. Of course, none of the scamps were to be found, they having made good their escape. The leather wallet containing the way-bill, etc., was found in the road, together with the bit of the safe and fragments of the coach, which was scattered for several hundred yards. Everything was gathered up and brought to the city. The robbers were armed with shotguns and Henry rifles, and had every advantage, even being acquainted with some of the passengers and calling them by name, but they could not be recognized themselves, their faces being blackened by the upper portion disguised with a cloth mask. The stage was detained by the robbery not far from an hour.
