TERRIBLE TRAGEDY.—An old and highly respected citizen of Mariposa, California, lately died under circumstances that point to his wife as the probable murderer. In a country like this, where help is difficult to obtain, and the wife is too often compelled to perform the whole labor of the household, a machine like this is invaluable, and should be procured even if the husband has to compromise in the matter of cigars and toddies. One of these machines is in use in our family, and hence we may be presumed to speak with a full understanding of its merits.

COUNTY FINANCES.—At an adjourned meeting of the Board of Commissioners, held on Wednesday last, Mr. Jas. McAuliff, late County Treasurer, appeared and turned over all the books belonging to the Treasurer's office, and also signified his readiness to pay over the county money in his hands. This action of Mr. McA. relieves the Board from all further difficulty in relation to the finances, and will enable parties having claims against the County to secure their just dues. The squabble over the county finances had come to be a serious annoyance to both the officials and the tax-payers, and all will rejoice that the difficulty has been satisfactorily adjusted.

THE SCHNEBLEY ROAD.—It seems to us—although we are not fully posted in regard to the laws governing the matter—that the County Commissioners should at once declare the Schnebley, or lower road, a county road, taking into consideration the fact that more than two-thirds of the travel by teams, and both stages go that way. There is a good house kept at the Touchet, via this lower, or Schnebley road, while there is no accommodation of any kind on the upper, or county road. Let the Commissioners at once declare this a county road, and have it put in good condition right away. The amount of freighting done on this road demands that it should receive the attention of our county officials immediately.

WASHINGTON NEWS.

CHICAGO, Nov. 15.—A Times' special says it is understood that the President will devote a considerable portion of his message to finance. The collection of revenue evidence shows that over \$100,000,000 have been lost from whiskey alone, the last year by the inefficiency and corruption of revenue officers. The President has determined to correct these abuses. General Schofield has decided, after a consultation with the President, to arrest persons making incendiary speeches in his district, or doing any act to array the white and black races against each other. The latest phase of the Presidential movement mentions John W. Forney's name for Vice President. Forney has assured his friends that he and Grant will sweep Pennsylvania by fifty thousand.

THE CHIEF AT WORK. BALTIMORE, Nov. 14.—Edward A. Pollard, author of the history of "The Lost Cause," was attacked while walking in the street with his wife, by the son and nephew of Henry A. Wise, who both fired at Pollard, striking him in the arm. Pollard returned the fire, but without effect.

METEORIC DISPLAY. DETROIT, Mich., Nov. 14.—Prof. Watson, of the Michigan Observatory, reports a fine display of meteors this morning, notwithstanding the light of the full moon. He counted 1,500 hourly. The number actually visible was much greater. NEW YORK, Nov. 14.—Sylvester Quiller a murderer was hung at Elizabeth today, for the murder of a negro. He made a dying speech and declared rum and gam to have been the cause of his crime.

NEW HAMPSHIRE POLITICS. CONCORD, N. H., Nov. 14.—The democratic Convention nominated J. G. Sinclair for Governor.

FLORIDA ELECTION. TALLAHASSEE, Fla., Nov. 14.—The election is progressing quietly, the whites generally declining to vote. A convention will undoubtedly be called.

THE LINCOLN ESTATE. SPRINGFIELD, Ill., Nov. 14.—Judge Davis, administrator of Lincoln's estate, has made a final settlement. After paying all debts there remains \$110,000, one third of which goes to Mrs. Lincoln.

MINNESOTA ELECTION. CHICAGO, Nov. 15.—The Republicans of Minnesota have conceded the defeat of the suffrage amendment by a close vote. The remote counties gave immensely large majorities against the amendment.

FROM SOUTH AMERICA. NEW YORK, Nov. 14.—The Tribune's Buenos Ayres correspondence says that the generals in the field have agreed to the terms of peace. An armistice has been concluded and the treaty sent to the respective governments for confirmation.

TERRIBLE STORM IN THE WEST INDIES. HAVANA, Nov. 15.—Special advices from Porto Rico of Nov. 7, of a terrible hurricane visited the southern portion of the island and destroyed all the crops. 2,000 lives were lost and 4,000 families were made destitute. Tortuga was completely submerged by the flood on the day succeeding the gale. It is reported that 10,000 lives were lost. Subscriptions have been opened at Havana for the relief of the St. Thomas sufferers. The loss of the steamship company will reach \$12,000,000. Five hundred more bodies have been buried.

BY ATLANTIC CABLE. PARIS, Nov. 14.—Previous to the departure of the French troops from Rome, the Pope received the successful officers at the Vatican and addressed them in a feeling manner, expressing his gratitude to France and the Emperor for the deliverance of the Holy See. He was grieved that Italy harbored anarchists against Rome. Their banners were inscribed with rapine and devastation. The valor of the Pontifical troops, which so successfully defended the soil of the Church and of the French army, are crowned with splendid honors. The Pope concluded by saying he had the consolation of receiving the sincere expressions of Catholic sympathy from all parts of the world. He then gave the Apostolic blessing to the armies and people and Emperor of France.

LONDON, Nov. 14.—The London Times editorially comments on the last note of Menabrea, and declares the abolition of the Pope's temporal power is essential to the preservation of peace, and calls it Italy's ultimatum to France.

Maguire, one of five prisoners convicted of the murder of a Manchester policeman, has been pardoned. Maguire stoutly maintained his innocence throughout.

The bullion in the Bank of England has decreased £940,000 since the 7th inst.

LONDON, Nov. 14.—Late dispatches from Italy state that the feeling against the French has reached a perfect furor. The authorities have taken precautions to prevent an attack, which is imminent. More French troops have been sent to Civita Vecchia. Victor Emanuel and Menabrea, are very officers at the Vatican, the former Premier, has openly joined the radical party. The King has called out the reserve army and ordered the formation of three large companies. Garibaldi is still closely confined.

The Italia of this morning scolds the news of the coup d'etat by the insurgents, and says the National Diet will soon meet.

NEW YORK, Nov. 15.—A Herald special from Naples says Mount Vesuvius is in volcanic action, sending forth a pillar of fire, which has a magnificent appearance. New craters have been formed, and red hot stones are ejected in large quantities. The surrounding earth has a tremendous motion for a considerable distance, and lava is pouring down the sides of the mountain. The general upheaving gives warning of a grand eruption.

THE matrimonial business, according to the New Haven papers, has been unusually lively in that city for the past few days, but they add that this does not give much encouragement, as the Superior Court has unmarried more persons than the clergy have married.

The church in which General Washington was married to Martha Custis, in New Kent County, Virginia, is very much dilapidated, and its congregation too poor to repair it. Contributions are therefore solicited to aid in preserving this historical relic.

It is understood from good authority, that the President has decided not to make the contemplated Cabinet changes at present. General Grant states that no appointment as Secretary of War will be made until after the meeting of Congress.

A SOCIETY entitled the "Sons of Jackson" has been started in the Southern States, and is rapidly spreading north among the Conservatives and Democrats. It is to operate as an offset against the Grand Army of the Republic.
