Health Ordinance.

The STATESMAN has frequently of late called attention to the fact, that the Health Ordinance as placed upon the records, was not only faulty and incomplete, but actually harmful, in many of its provisions, and that the old one should be drawn, or a new one so amended as to properly meet the demands. It is gratifying to be able to state that this has been decided upon, and very properly, the Health Officer, Dr. Sloan, has been requested to do the work.

The new ordinance makes the Health Officer the sole receiver of all reports from physicians and makes it the duty of all physicians in attendance on any person sick with small-pox, cholera, yellow-fever, typhus fever, typhoid fever, scarlet fever, diphtheria, typhoid fever, scarlet fever or diphtheria, to report the same to the Health Officer within six hours after such physician has become satisfied of the nature of the disease.

From such reports the Health Officer shall keep a register and from that make at least a quarterly report to the City Council and a public report to the City and State.

The coroner had not concluded the inquest when our informant left Pendleton. The theory among the people at Pendleton is that Mulherson was killed in a drunken row, among the Indians collected about the "Queen's" quarters.

Pierson. At the public court Justice Whitman assessed the young man \$25 and costs, which included some pertinent remarks about a man's stealing in this land of milk and honey.
