At the December Term, 1862, of the Supreme Court of Washington Territory, the following cases and places were fixed by said Court for holding Court in the several Judicial Districts of said Territory, to-wit:

U. S. District Courts

FIRST DISTRICT—At Walla Walla, County of Walla Walla, on the 4th Monday in April, and 2nd Monday in October, so continued for three weeks unless sooner adjourned.

SECOND DISTRICT—At Vancouver, Clark County, on the 10th Monday in May, and 2nd Monday in November, so continued for three weeks unless sooner adjourned.

THIRD DISTRICT—At Olympia, Thurston County on the 1st Monday in February and 3rd Monday in July, so continued for 2 weeks unless sooner adjourned.

To take effect in the 3d District after the March Term 1863, of said Court.

Districts Courts for the transaction of Territorial business, to be holden at

STILLACOOM, Pierce County, on the 4th Monday in February and 3d Monday in August.

AS OLYMPIA, on the 1st Monday in April, and 2nd Monday in March and 1st Monday in September.

PINKNEY CITY, Spokane County, on the 2nd Monday in June.

PIRENE CITY, Shoshone County, on the 2nd Monday in August.

FLORENCE CITY, Idaho County, on the 1st Monday in September.

RAYNOCK CITY, Boise County, on the 1st Monday in September.

Third Judicial District, in addition to the regular terms, for the purpose of hearing and disposing of cases within the Admiralty and Maritime Jurisdiction, said Court:

AS OLYMPIA, on the 1st Monday of every month, except February, July and September.

AS PORT TOWNSEND, on the second Monday in March and 1st Monday in September.

AS TERRY, on the 1st Monday in September.

AS S. S. Territory of Washington, S. S. County Treasurer.
