DECLARATION OF DANIEL JOHN

I, Daniel John Chirillo, declare as follows:

1. I am over the age of eighteen (18) years and make this Declaration based on personal knowledge.

2. I am a registered voter in King County, Washington. My address is 1913 214th Court SE, Sammamish, WA 98075. My date of birth is June 25, 1958. My voter registration number is 760483842. My voter registration card was issued on October 6, 2001 and shows I have been a registered voter since August 14, 1976.

3. I went to my polling location to vote on November 2, 2004. The poll workers said I could not vote with a regular ballot because I was not on the voter roll. I therefore voted with a provisional ballot. The week after the election, I went onto the King County Elections web site to determine whether my provisional ballot was counted. The web site said my provisional ballot had been received. It also said that my provisional ballot would not be counted because my absentee ballot had been received and counted.


4. Because I had never asked for, received, or voted with an absentee ballot, I called the King County Elections Office to get more information. What I learned is that when they pulled up the computer record for my registration, they had replaced my date of birth and address with those of my nephew, Daniel Kenichi Chirillo, who had recently moved to Sammamish. The record indicated that they mailed an absentee ballot to my nephew. When he returned his absentee ballot, they counted it as if it had been mine. The Elections office staff person did not know what to do to fix the problem and said they would call me back with more information.

5. I went in person to the King County Elections Office on November 15, 2004. I spoke to supervisor Carlos Webb at the fifth floor office. He took my registration card and looked at his computer records. He came back with printouts from the computer record showing that my nephew's information had been added onto my record. Mr. Webb explained that he would fix the problem by making a new record for my nephew and copying the absentee ballot history into his record. Mr. Webb also explained that he would update my own voting history and ensure my provisional ballot was counted. He said I should be able to verify that my vote was counted through the web site on Tuesday November 16.
