I am pleased to present the 2021 General Election Voters' Pamphlet. We offer this comprehensive guide as a reference to help you find information about the candidates and measures that appear on your ballot.

This general election you will have the opportunity to vote for local officials and measures that could have a significant impact on your community. Yet in order to make your voice heard, you must be registered to vote. Voter registration forms that are mailed or completed online must be received by Oct. 25, and we encourage you to check your registration information today at **VoteWA.gov**. After Oct. 25, you must visit your local elections office or voting center during regular business hours and until 8 p.m. on Election Day to register to vote or update your registration and receive a ballot.

Once you have completed your ballot, be sure to sign the return envelope. This is important, as election officials verify your signature matches the one on your voter registration file before they can count your ballot. Then, send your ballot via U.S. mail — no postage needed. Remember, all ballots must be postmarked by Nov. 2 in order to be counted. The U.S. Postal Service recommends that you mail a week before Election Day. You can also return your ballot using an official ballot drop box anywhere in the state. Drop boxes are open until 8 p.m. the day of the election. Check **VoteWA.gov** to locate a ballot drop box.

By voting, you are ensuring your voice is heard. Make an impact in your community and our state by voting this fall.





The federal Voting Rights Act requires translated elections materials.

Qualifications

You must be at least 18 years old, a U.S. citizen, a resident of Washington, and not under Department of Corrections supervision



for a Washington felony conviction. If you're 16 or 17 years old, you can sign up as a Future Voter and be automatically registered to vote when you qualify.

How do I register to vote?

By mail: Request a paper form be mailed to you or print your own at **sos.wa.gov/elections**

No internet access? Call 1 (800) 448-4881.

In person: Visit a county elections office (listed at the end of this pamphlet).

Registration deadlines



By mail or online:

Your application must be received no later than October 25.

In person: Visit a local voting center no later than 8 p.m. on November 2.

Check your registration info at **VoteWA.gov**.

Moved? Update your voting address

Contact a county elections office to request a ballot at your new address.

By October 25: Have your application received by mail or updated online.

Or

By November 2: Visit a local voting center in person.

What if I'm not 18 yet?



If you are 16 or 17, become a Future Voter!




Sign up online at **VoteWA.gov** with your Washington state driver's license or ID. Or you can fill out a paper registration form using the last four digits of your Social Security number and mail it in. You'll be automatically registered to vote when you qualify.

Every January on Temperance and Good Citizenship Day, high school students 16 and older have the opportunity to complete a voter registration form in class.




If you're registered to vote, there is no need to request a ballot. Your ballot will be mailed **October 15** to the address you provide in your voter registration. If you need a replacement ballot, contact a county elections office listed at the end of this pamphlet.







Vote your ballot and sign your return envelope. We need your signature to accept your ballot. You are not required to vote every race on your ballot. We encourage using this pamphlet to help you decide.



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
Return your ballot by mail, no stamp needed. If mailed, your ballot must be postmarked by **November 2**. Don't let a late postmark disqualify your ballot. The USPS recommends that you mail a week before Election Day.







If you cannot personally return your ballot, let only people you trust deliver it for you.











Election staff will contact you before your ballot is processed if:

- Your signature is missing
- Your signature doesn't match your voter registration record

View election results online

After 8 p.m. on election night, tallied results from each county are posted at sos.wa.gov/elections.

Results are updated as counties report and unofficial until certification.

When reviewing online or printed information, think about:

Who made this, and who is it for?


Was it a company, or an individual person? Who is the intended audience?



Why did they make it?

Think about the purpose. Is it to inform, entertain, or persuade?





When was this made?

Is the information relevant today?



What makes it believable?

Is there evidence from a reputable source or expert?

How might other people read this message?

Consider how someone with a different background might interpret it.



Ask the experts

Consult a fact-checking site or ask an official source. Get trusted info from your county auditor or elections office.



Advisory votes are the result of Initiative 960, approved by voters in 2007. The Office of the Secretary of State publishes the Attorney General's advisory vote description according to RCW 29A.72.283.

You are advising the Legislature if you do or do not favor a tax increase passed during the recent legislative session.

Repeal — means you don't favor the tax increase.

Maintain — means you **favor** the tax increase.



Advisory votes are non-binding.
The results will not change the law.

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Keep your voting address confidential

If you are a survivor of domestic violence, sexual assault, trafficking, stalking, or an employee in criminal justice and target of felony harassment on the job, you may be able to enroll in the Address Confidentiality Program and register as a Protected Records Voter.

To become a Protected Records Voter:

- You must first meet with a Certified Advocate who can assist with threat assessment, safety planning, and the program application.
- The best time to enroll is when you move or are planning to move to a location that is unknown to the offender and undocumented in public record.

Judicial Qualifications & Responsibilities

Washington judges are nonpartisan. Judges must be registered Washington voters.

Judges

Judicial candidates must be in good standing to practice law in Washington and are prohibited from statements that appear to commit them on legal issues that may come before them in court.

State Supreme Court Justice

The Washington Supreme Court is the highest judiciary in the state. State Supreme Court justices hear appeals and decide cases from Courts of Appeals and other lower courts. Nine justices are elected statewide to serve sixyear terms.

Court of Appeals Judge

Court of Appeals judges hear appeals from Superior Courts. A total of 22 judges serve three divisions headquartered in Seattle, Tacoma, and Spokane. Court of Appeals judges serve six-year terms.

Superior Court Judge

Superior Courts hear felony criminal cases, civil matters, divorces, juvenile cases, and appeals from the lower courts. Superior Courts are organized by county into 30 districts. Superior Court judges serve four-year terms.



To participate in this election, you must be registered to vote in Washington. You may check your registration status anytime online at VoteWA.gov until 8 days before Election Day. In the week before the election, if you are not registered, have moved since the last time you voted, or did not receive a ballot, you will need to register or make changes in person at the Stevens County Auditor's Office during regular business hours and until 8:00 p.m. on Election Day. To ensure we can expedite our services to you, please call before you arrive at our office. We can be reached at 509-684-7514.

Your ballot return envelope now comes with prepaid postage, so you can drop it into either a ballot drop box or any U.S.P.S. Mailbox. Make sure to drop it into a ballot drop box by 8:00 p.m. on Election Day or if you use the mail, remember to get a postmark on or before Election Day, November 2 to have your ballot counted.

Preliminary election results will be posted to our website at vote.stevenscountywa.gov soon after voting closes on Election Night.

By voting, you are ensuring your voice is heard as you help choose our elected officials. Make an impact by voting this November!

Replacement ballots for this election may be issued up to Election Day and are available online on our website: vote.stevenscountywa.gov selecting the MY VOTE option, or by contacting the elections department.

Law does permit a person to register to vote between eight (8) days and the day of an election if that person comes in person to the Auditor's Office/ Election Department to register or transfer registration in the State of Washington. The deadline for registering through this process is November 2, 2021 at 8:00 pm.

Returning Your Ballot

The General Election shall be held entirely by mail and your ballot will be mailed approximately 18 days prior to the election.

Returned ballots must be postmarked no later than Election Day. Postage is paid for your returned envelope. You may also return your ballot in person to an Official Ballot Drop off site or to the Stevens County Auditor's Office.



Explanatory Statement For Proposition No. 1 - Replacement Capital Levy For Health, Safety And Educational Improvements

Passage of Proposition No. 1 would allow the Chewelah School District to replace an existing capital levy that will expire at the end of calendar year 2021. The taxes collected by this replacement levy will be used to make health, safety and educational improvements throughout existing school facilities, including, but not limited to: (1) constructing science classrooms and repairing/resurfacing tennis courts and parking lot at Jenkins High School: (2) making Phase II Snyder Field improvements; (3) upgrading and/or improving exterior lighting, maintenance equipment, sidewalk/concrete at Gess Elementary School and Jenkins High School, and Gess Elementary School foundation: The School Board determined that these improvements are necessary due to the existing condition of school facilities and the needs of the District's educational programs. ther information is available on the District's website at https://www.chewelah.k12.wa.us/.

The proposed three-year replacement capital levy would authorize collection of taxes to provide \$425,511 each year from 2022 through and including 2024. The tax levy rate required to produce these levy amounts is estimated to be \$0.70 per \$1,000 of assessed value. Exemptions from taxes may be available to certain homeowners. Argument For

Chewelah Citizens for Kids is asking for support and a yes vote on the Replacement Capital Levy for Health, Safety & Educational improvements to our district. This three-year levy is a continuation of the last two capital levies that have brought much-needed improvements to the district including the Snyder Track and Field Complex and facility safety and technology.

Since 2016 the Capital Levy has collected .70 cents on \$1,000 assessed property value and this rate will remain the same.

This Capital Levy has taken into account the needs of all areas of the district. Remodeling two science rooms in the high school will allow our district to offer expanded courses related to science and will give students advanced opportunities that the district cannot currently provide. In order to offer tennis and allow the community to safely enjoy the tennis courts, the required resurfacing will be done through this levy. The Snyder Track and Field Complex announcer booth will be replaced and critical improvements related to ADA guidelines will be completed. Continuing on the theme of safety within the district, energy-efficient LED lighting and replacement of deteriorating asphalt and sidewalks will be part of this levy as well.

In response to community demand for a swimming pool in the City of Kettle Falls, and because the current pool requires expensive repairs and updates that far exceed its value, a private donor has come forward to fund removal of the old swimming pool and construction of a new swimming pool in Kettle Falls. The new pool would be managed by the Upper Columbia Pool District and maintained by the City of Kettle Falls at the current location. The pool would provide public access for recreational swimming and lessons for youth and adults, water aerobics and rehabilitation, and competitive swimming.

Passage of a levy is necessary to generate funds which will be used exclusively for ongoing maintenance and operations of the new pool. If the measure is approved, it is estimated that the tax rate would increase approximately \$0.23 per \$1,000 of assessed value which would, for example, result in an increase in annual taxes in the amount of \$23 on property with an assessed value of \$100,000. If approved this tax rate would be in effect for four years and thereafter eligible for renewal.
