Washington Remembers Essay/Letter-Writing Competition

Sponsored by Legacy Washington, a program of the Office of the Secretary of State

Washington Remembers is a multifaceted tribute to veterans of one of the most violent conflicts in history. Our project includes free online profiles of veterans, an online photo gallery and an exhibit that will be on display in the Legislative Building in Olympia, Wash., from August 20, 2015, through June 30, 2016.

Our stories take you around the globe to crucial battles on foreign soil, to German concentration camps and to the American home front where defense plant workers contributed to the war effort. Our exhibit features large compelling photographs, personal stories fascinating war facts along with other primary source artifacts that include handwritten letters, wartime pamphlets and chronologies.

Writing Contest

Legacy Washington is sponsoring an essay and letter-writing contest for 8-11th grade students. It begins this September 9th as the school year gets under way and ends on November 20, 2015-DECEMBER 18th. Washington State teachers are encouraged to invite their classrooms to participate in this special opportunity to enhance the *Washington Remembers* project.

Students are asked to either write a letter to a veteran (living or deceased) or an essay describing what WWII means to them. All entries must be submitted no later than November 20, and a winner will be announced at the beginning of the 2016 Legislative Session by a panel of judges. A winner from each grade will be selected and invited to a ceremony in Secretary Wyman's office and presented with a special certificate and a \$100 gift card. Winning essays will also be posted on the Secretary of State's website, featured in SOS publications and appear alongside *Washington Remembers* exhibit.

Essays/Letters can be no more than 500 words. When turning in your entries please include: teacher name, teacher's score, student name, school name, grade and school district.


