Key dates



July 19— Start of voting period and deadline for counties to mail out ballots to voters

July 29 — Last day for online and mailed registrations or updates to be received

July 30 — USPS recommends mailing voted ballot back at least one week before election day

August 6 — Special Election Day:

- Register or update info and vote in person by 8 p.m.
- Mailed ballot must be postmarked by today
- Official ballot drop boxes are open until 8 p.m.

August 20 - County Canvassing Boards certify results

August 23— Last day for Secretary of State to certify Primary Election results


