What is a Special Election?



Key dates



January 24 — Start of voting period and deadline for counties to mail out ballots to voters

February 3 — Last day for online and mailed registrations or updates to be received

February 4 — USPS recommends mailing voted ballot back at least one week before election day

February 11 — Special Election Day:

- Register or update info and vote in person by 8 p.m.
- Mailed ballot must be postmarked by today
- Official ballot drop boxes are open until 8 p.m.

February 21 — County Canvassing Boards certify results
