October 17 — Start of voting period and deadline for counties to mail out ballots to voters

October 27 — Last day for online and mailed registrations or updates to be received

October 28 — USPS recommends mailing voted ballot back at least one week before Election Day

November 4 — Election Day:

- Register or update info and vote in person by 8 p.m.
- Mailed ballot must be postmarked by today
- Official ballot drop boxes are open until 8 p.m.

November 25 — County canvassing boards certify General Election results

December 4 — Last day for Secretary of State to certify General Election results




