Referendum Bill No. 12 (1964)

The legislature imposed, without a vote of the people, authorizing the issuance and sale of state limited obligation bonds in an amount not exceeding \$59,000,000; appropriating the proceeds for state matching funds for constructing public school plant facilities.

House Joint Resolution 6 (1970)
